



Spajazzy

Following the gallery reception from 6:30 to 8 pm, enjoy the sounds of **Spajazzy**, best described as “electric-jazz with an Italian flare.” The music employs world rhythms and Mediterranean melodies with a funk edge. Founded in 1998 by Sergio Bellotti and Tino D'Agostino, Spajazzy is a musical project where labels find no meaning. Together, these musicians felt the urge to incorporate the melodic music background of their native country of Italy with the idioms of jazz rhythms and harmonies they were learning in North America. Whether playing an original composition or a rendition of a classic, they strive to make sure the melody remains the center of what carries the rhythm, the harmony and all the colors in between these elements.

The seasonal crafts show will feature two floors of beautiful hand-made fabric art, jewelry, picture frames, photography and more, located in an 1864-era woodworking mill building. Visitors also will have the unique opportunity to purchase the custom-made, hand turned wooden oval and circular frames made by woodworker **David W. Graf** at the Old Schwamb Mill.
